Wenatchee Valley College is seeking an adjunct instructor to join its art faculty, teaching beginning and intermediate Ceramics classes beginning in fall quarter of 2024.

Ceramics is an important discipline in WVC's thriving Art Program, with a strong tradition of instruction across a range of levels of expertise and student types. We maintain a well-equipped ceramics studio adjacent to the Music and Art Center, which houses studios for Graphic Design, Design and Printmaking, Drawing, Painting, and Sculpture, as well as a department-run exhibition space, the MAC Gallery.

In addition to teaching duties, the successful candidate may also have the option of paid studio technician hours to manage the ceramics facilities.

The ability to teach in a secondary area (drawing, painting, printmaking, design, sculpture, art history) would be considered beneficial.

Examples of Duties and Responsibilities:

- Prepare or modify course content including syllabi, presentations and lessons, in accordance with college course outlines.
- Provide appropriately challenging instruction for assigned courses, including preparation for educational activities, evaluation of students' work, and consultations with students to help them realize their full potential as learners.
- Maintain accurate class and other records required by the college.
- Give feedback and progress reports to students during the quarter and submit final grades at the end of the quarter.
- Maintain office hours.
- Work cooperatively within the department and college community.
- Foster a positive working environment that is free from harassment, prejudice and/or bias, and demonstrate a respect for the dignity of everyone.

Desired Qualifications:

- An MFA or Master's degree in a related field, or commitment to obtaining a degree in the near future.
- Successful experience teaching Ceramics, especially at the college level.
- Expertise in wheel throwing, hand building, glazing, and firing ceramics, as well as a sense of how ceramics fits into contemporary artmaking theory and practice.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.

- Studio management experience, including ceramics area ordering and maintenance.
- A robust artistic practice with a history of exhibitions.
- Experience utilizing a Learning Management System, such as Canvas.
- A demonstrated commitment to promoting equity, diversity, and inclusiveness in an educational environment.

We are looking for enthusiastic instructors who set high expectations but are eager to help students meet those expectations.

Interviews will include a teaching demonstration on a topic selected by the interview committee.
